Inspiration: 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Matthew 4:4

<u>The Bible</u>

We believe in the Bible as the vOerbally (every word) and plenary (completely) inspired Word of God, and that it was written inerrant in its original languages and has been providentially preserved "for all generations forever". All portions of Scripture are equally inspired and contain no contradiction. The Holy Bible has God as its Author (2 Peter 1:21), salvation for its end (2 Timothy 3:15), and truth for its matter (Proverbs 30:5-6).

The Scriptures are our only rule for faith and practice, the supreme standard by which all conduct, creeds, associations, and ministries should be tried (1 John 4:1). The canon, the sixty-six books of the Bible, is complete. Nothing shall be added to nor taken from it (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Hebrews 1:1; Revelation 22:18-19). To eliminate confusion, all preaching and teaching will be from the King James Version. We believe the King James Version of the Scriptures has been faithfully translated from the preserved Word of God.

 - Verbal: every word Plenary: The whole of Scripture They are God's Words. The words He chose to give mankind.
- B. The Type of Men God Chose through whom to inspire His Word Saved, holy men
- C. Methods God Used to Inspire the Scriptures
 - 1. Prophets speak Assistants wite it down Jer. 36:4; Rom. 16:22
 - 2. Prophets speak prophets write Gal. 6:1; Deut. 1:1 with 31:9
 - 3. God dictated God wrote Ex. 34:1
 - 4. God dictated prophet wrote Ex. 24:4
 - 5. God put His words in the prophets heart prophet wrote them down Num. 33:2
- D. God places the emphasis of inspiration on the individual words Although He speaks of Commandments, statutes, law, His word (singular), He emphasizes that every word is important, not just the message.
 Jer. 36:4; Ex. 34:1; 24:4; Ps. 12:6; Ps. 119:103, 130; Ps. 138:4
- E. Modern translation philosphy is that any words may be used, as long as the message is the same as the original. The truth is that an English translation must use English words that are the closest equivalents to God's Hebrew and Greek words.
- F. Statement of the Doctrine of the Inspiration of the Scriptures

Inspiration is the miraculous work of God whereby He gave His Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek words to mankind, through human instruments. God led men to write down all His words and so directed the process that they were written down perfectly, without error.

Preservation: Ps. 12:6-7; Mt. 5:18; Mt. 24:35

2 Timothy 3:14-15 says that Timothy knew the Scriptures from a child. He did not have the originals. He had copies, and yet they were called Scriptures. Moreover, Paul spoke of them as accurate copies. Many times, the Scriptures are spoken of in this same way throughout the New Testament.
